HIV and Cancer

INTRODUCTION

Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and malignancies have been linked since the early 1980s, when Kaposi's sarcoma (KS) was described in young men who also had concomitant symptoms of severe immunosuppression, a condition that was subsequently known as acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS). In addition to KS, people living with HIV (PLHIV) are at an increased risk of developing high-grade B-cell non-Hodgkin's lymphoma (NHL) and invasive carcinoma of the cervix. Hence, KS, NHL, and invasive carcinoma of the cervix are known as AIDS-defining cancers. 1,2

Other cancers such as Hodgkin's lymphoma (HL) anal, colorectal, and liver carcinoma, although not classified as AIDS-defining cancers, occur at increased frequency in PLHIV.³ They are referred to as non-AIDS-defining cancers (NADC). The cumulative incidence of developing certain NADCs, including anal, colorectal, and liver, continue to increase over the years, partially due to the prolonged survival of PLHIV.⁴

MANAGEMENT OF AIDS-DEFINING CANCERS

Kaposi's Sarcoma

KS, one of the earliest manifestations of severe immunosuppression as a result of HIV infection, is generally associated with severe immunosuppression but can also occur at any CD4+ cell count. The advent of combination antiretroviral therapy (cART) has led to a dramatic decrease in the incidence of KS in PLHIV.¹

KS is an endothelial cell tumor that is associated with human herpes virus 8 (HHV-8) infection, also known as KS-associated herpes virus (KSHV). Therefore, HIV patients with HHV-8 co-infection are at high risk of developing KS. Transmission of HHV-8 in endemic areas can occur through saliva, whereas in epidemic KS, sexual transmission appears to be the major mode of acquisition.

KS typically manifests as pigmented lesions involving skin, mucous membranes of the mouth, eyes, nose, and anus. Skin lesions occur as reddish, purple, or bluishbrown nodules, lesions, or patches. Skin lesions can lead to very painful swelling,


Pharmacists play a crucial role in public health initiatives e.g., vaccination, ensuring medication safety and promoting wellness within the community.





Annual Pharmacy Salary Overview (before taxes)

- Intern Pharmacist: AUD 55K-60K
- Registered Pharmacist: AUD 90K-140K
- Senior Hospital Pharmacist-Director of Pharmacy: 140-185K plus benefits
- Regional roles offer higher salaries
- Rural positions often come with additional benefits
- All salaries does not include Superannuation (11-17%) on top of annual salary

To become a pharmacist in Australia, individuals must complete specific educational programs and obtain necessary licenses and certifications to practice safely.

Educational Requirements

A Bachelor of
Pharmacy degree or
equivalent is essential to
become a licensed
pharmacist in Australia.

Licensing

Pharmacists must obtain a practicing license from the Pharmacy Board of Australia to work in the field.

Continuing Education

Ongoing professional development is required to maintain licenses and stay updated on pharmaceutical advancements and regulations.



Tips for a Smooth Transition

Here are some **essential tips** for your journey.





- Tailor your Resume/CV and Cover Letter: Make sure they are specifically tailored to Australian standards and the specific job description.
- Networking: Connect with pharmacists in Australia on Linkedln.
- Be Persistent: Job searching can take time.
- Consider Locum Work: Many overseas pharmacists start with locum (temporary) work through agencies.
- Highlight Registration Progress: If you're an overseas
 pharmacist, clearly state your current stage in the Ahpra/APC
 registration process in your applications.
